Dual Enrollment Opportunities

Students who would like to take a class that we do not offer or who have exhausted our curriculum in a certain content area may qualify to receive funds from the State of Michigan for Dual Enrollment classes. Classes must be academic in nature and cannot be in the area of physical education or theology. Students/families will be responsible for any costs not covered by the funds from the State of Michigan. Students who participate in dual enrollment are expected to follow the institution's policies and school calendar. Grades earned in dual enrollment courses will be added to the West Catholic transcript and will be awarded bonus points (0.018 points per class). If a student fails a course, the State of Michigan will no longer provide funds and it will be the student/family's responsibility to pay the entire bill. Due to FERPA the college will only communicate directly with students, not the parents.
